### Age Group Rules U7s and U8s

The game is for boys and girls (mixed football is allowed). The object is to keep the game flowing as much as possible and make sure the players enjoy themselves.

### Age Limits

**U7s - Over 6 but Under 7 as at Midnight August 31st.**  
**U8s - Over 6 but Under 8 as at Midnight August 31st.**

- Team size shall be 7v7.
- The playing area should be maximum size 50 metres x 40 metres, minimum size 40 metres x 30 metres. Cones can be used to mark touch and goal lines.
- The Penalty area shall be designated by a marked out rectangle, size 16.5 metres (18 yards) wide by 9.2 metres (10 yards) deep from the goal line. The penalty area can either be marked by cones on the touchline or one or two marker cones across the playing area.
- The penalty spot shall be in the centre of the penalty area 7.3 metres (8 yards) from the goal line.
- The goal size for all age groups is 12 ft X 6 ft (3.6m x 1.8m). The Samba Junior Multigoal, Harrods and Coca-Cola Big Red Bag goals are suitable. Goals must be secured in accordance with manufacturers instructions.
- Goal nets and corner flags are compulsory.
- The ball should be a size 3.
- A maximum of 3 substitutes may be used at any time with the permission of the referee. Players may re-enter the game and all substitutes must have a period of play.
- Players shall wear shin guards, which shall be entirely covered by stockings.
- A Referee should be allocated to every match. It is his decision as to whether he requires Assistant Referees to run the line. All Referees must have a Red and Yellow card plus a note book. It is the responsibility of the home team to ensure this.
- Duration of matches should be 20 minutes each way with no one playing more than 45 minutes per day.
- The kick off is taken in the centre of the playing area to start the game and after a goal has been scored.
- There is no off-side
- All Free kicks are direct
- Throw-ins should be taken in the normal way. A player making a foul throw should be given the chance to take it again.
- The opposition should be at least 4.5 metres (5 yards) away when a corner kick, free kick or centre kick is being taken.
- Goalkeepers can handle the ball in the penalty area and there are no restrictions on the number of steps they may take when holding the ball. They may return the ball into play by either drop kicking it or throwing it out of the penalty area.
- Goal kicks are to be taken from the goalkeeper's hands.
- Defensive free kicks within the penalty area should be kicked from the edge of the penalty area.
- The back pass rule does not apply.
- Club officials who referee a match should refrain from coaching.
- Players should shake hands at the end of each match.
- Common sense should prevail at all times.
- Except where otherwise provided above, the Laws of Association football will apply.
- All Referees must be paid before the start of the match by the home team and the costs split equally between the two teams.
